Just when I thought it wasn't possible, the boys really lifted up a notch or two for this match with huge enthusiasm and a dominant all-round team performance, which earned them a well-deserved ticket to the big dance.

Grand Final vs Wagga City Cats:

The boys turned up on GF Day as pumped and focused as I have even seen them. Admittedly, I didn't have to do too much talking on the day, I took much pride taking a step back and listened to them, repeating what I had been saying to them all season long amongst themselves.

We batted first and got off to a solid start with Judd (15) and Cooper (8) hitting some great impressive shots. Max, Lucas, Charlie and Joey all contributed to the total, though credit to the Cats, it has to be said that we were facing some tight bowling and good fielding. We found ourselves at 6/70 with a real test on our hands to get ourselves back into the game. Enter: Bryce and Tommy. These two boys took to the crease with level heads and showed composure beyond their years. They played a smart innings with some high-quality shots and partnered to add a further 28 runs, which the team and I knew we could defend. Bryce and Will ended up batting out the overs, Will with a steady straight bat (9 n.o) and Bryce, seeing them like beachballs by this stage, top-scored on 55 n.o. The boys finished the innings at 7/150.

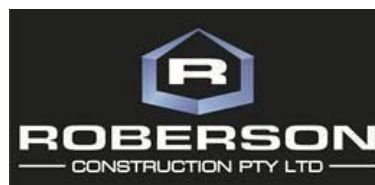
